




Students Centric Curriculum and Support



Curriculum Design and Flexibility

- BU is the first in the state to adopt CBCS in 2015
- Syllabi under CBCS follows UGC pattern in the contents of curriculum
- In a way the courses offered by the university are interdisciplinary in nature with the flexibility of students opting open electives from other disciplines
- Undertake periodic minor and major revision of syllabi with feedbacks from stakeholders, local needs, changing job markets
- Assessment process comprises of continuous internal assessment, classroom and home assignments, classroom presentation, field & project works and summative assessment consisting of MCQ, very short and short answer questions
- FYUP under NEP2020 is implemented from the current academic session 2023-24 as in other state universities in Assam


Feedback System in Place




Destination for Higher Education is Bodoland University




Enrolment by Gender




Papers with Focus on Employability and Total Papers



Number of Students Appeared and Passed in PG Courses











Expenditure on Infrastructure Development and Maintenance (Excluding Salary Component)








