



WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY 2021

OBSERVED BY NSS CELL AND DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY

World Environment Day aims to spread awareness about the threat to the environment due to rising pollution levels and climate change. The 1st World Environment Day was observed in 1974, under the slogan :Only One Earth",giving a global platform for inspiring positive environmental change. The theme of the WED 2021 is "Reimagine, Recreate, Restore". The central vision behind it is that we cannot turn back time. However, we can grow trees, green our cities, rewild our gardens, change our diets and clean up rivers and coasts. We are the generation that can make peace with nature. This momentous day will kick start the UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration (2021-2030) to revive hectares of land from forests to farmlands, from the top of the mountains to the depth of the sea?

Theme

Parallel to the theme, the NSS Cell, Bodoland University, in collaboration with the Department of Geography, Bodoland University, Kokrajhar, Assam, has organized four days plantation drive from June 1 to June 4, 2021, followed by a webinar on June 5, 2021, to create awareness among students and NSS volunteers working under BU NSS banner.

A total number of 184 participants have joined the virtual webinar on June 5, 2021, including students, volunteers of NSS units of Colleges and BU under Bodoland University, and faculties of colleges and Bodoland University.

Plantation Programme (June 1 to June 4, 2021)

As per the call from NSS CELL Bodoland University, NSS volunteers and students of the Department of Geography, BU, has participated in the mass plantation programme. Due to the COVID pandemic situations, students and volunteers have planted saplings in their residential surroundings from June 1 to June 4, 2021, and sent the plantation photographs. Around 250 saplings of different species have been planted as per record. The sapling species range from native fruit-bearing plants to other non-fruit bearing woody plants and decorative plants. Participants also have promised to take care of the samplings until they become mature and resistant to external shocks.

Overview on the topic of Discussion (June 5, 2021) made by Dr Bibhab Kumar Talukdar:

Ecosystem Restoration

Northeast India has diverse altitudinal gradients that provide different ecosystems and require special attention for biodiversity preservation and conservation. Wetlands are such a kind of ecosystem that we often consider them as wasteland. The grassland ecosystem in Assam is home to the unique one-horned Rhino and Bengal *Florida*. Therefore, conversion of these grasslands and wetlands bring threat to such type of species. Therefore, there is a need to identify the ecological restoration goal, identify the restoration potential of a site, conduct the restoration, and evaluate the success.

Need for Ecosystem Restoration:

Ecosystem services, habitat for threatened or endangered species, improving human livelihood, empowering local people, improving ecosystem productivity are primary reasons why ecosystem restoration is necessary.

The speaker specifically focused on the domains where ecosystem restoration is essential. Dr Talukdar pointed out that the analysis of satellite images from 1994 to 2021 shows that there has been the development of patches of discontinuity in the Nameri Forest area due to human interference. A similar kind is an evidence in the Golaghat district, where the continuity of forest across north-south extension is disturbed due to encroachment and in return, there is increasing evidence of human-elephant conflict.

Rhino Conservation Method: There is a sudden spike in the number (41) of Rhino poaching in 2012-2013 in Kaziranga National Park. However, halting the poaching will not completely stop the assault on such vulnerable animals. The silent killer is the invasive plant species that can facilitate the death of rhinos by providing less nutrient food and hideout for poachers. The process involves manually uprooted the invasive plants by engaging local youths from the fringe villages and fenced the area with a non-fatal solar-powered fence to control grazing by livestock. So far, around 20 ha of rhino habitat at two sites of Manas National Park has been restored. It also helps the local people to earn some livelihood and make awareness about conservation and preservation.

Key takeaways: He also focuses on enhancing the forest cover by taking the example of the recent death of 18 elephants due to lighting in Assam. Planting a tree is a good initiative, but it may not create a forest. Nevertheless, planning is vital if we want to restore a forest, and students can play an essential role in such ecosystem restoration. Let us concentrate on few areas and make an effort for months and years in most scientific ways to see the progressive improvement of the forest or wetland so that the degraded areas can be restored. Planting few trees on the roadside is a good initiative, but if we want to convert a degraded ecosystem, the planning needs to be more scientific and robust.

Dr Dhillon elaborately explained the various statistical techniques used to analyze the diverse nature of geographical and economic data and their proper selection method.

The programme commenced with a welcome speech by Prof. Sujit Deka, HoD of Geography and president of the workshop. With a warm welcome to all, Prof. Deka introduces the department proffering various programmes conducted and shared the Geography department's vision to the august gathering. The programme was inaugurated by the honourable Vice-Chancellor of Bodoland University, Prof. Lishram Ladu Singh. Prof. Singh sir highlighted the importance of the workshop's theme and described the need of choosing appropriate statistical techniques and their relevance to data representation. His speech is an eye-opening for the young researchers to learn the various statistical techniques and adopt appropriate methods for the data analysis.


International Webinar on Research Methodology

The Department of Geography of Bodoland University organised an International Webinar on Research Methodology in collaboration with the Research Innovation and Extension Committee for NAAC, Bodoland University on the 19th and the 20th of July, 2021. The webinar was organised keeping in view some of the essential methodological requirements of the young teachers and researchers in various humanities, social sciences, and general sciences. The webinar comprised of two lectures by two eminent scholars associated with research activities for years.

The first lecture of the webinar titled "Understanding Research Integrity, Ethics and Plagiarism" was delivered by Prof. Hiranya K. Nath, from the Department of Economics and International Business, Sam Heuston State University Huntsville, the US, in the 19th of July. In his inaugural speech of the webinar, Professor Laishram Ladu Singh, Vice-Chancellor of Bodoland University, set the stage for intellectual deliberation by talking about the importance of maintaining the integrity and research ethics in his inaugural speech. In the lecture, Prof. Nath spoke about the basic need for honesty on the part of a researcher to contribute something new to the vast ocean of knowledge. In his oneand-a-half-hour-long lecture, Professor Nath touched upon various vital factors like unintentional errors, research misconduct, multiple types of plagiarisms, authorship etc. to be taken care of by researchers in the process of ethical writing. He also spoke on how to choose a suitable journal for publishing one's articles. It is always very tricky to differentiate between predatory journals, first copy or duplicate journals, and good, authentic ones. Besides that, Professor Nath spoke on the necessity of maintaining a good list of references and bibliography for any research project to be completed successfully.

Dr Rituparna Bhattacharyya delivered the second lecture of the webinar, SFHEA (Senior Fellow, Advance Higher Education) and Editor in Chief (Joint) of Journal of Space and Culture, on the 20th of July, 2021. In her lecture titled "Working for Scholarly Outlets", Dr Bhattacharyya deliberated on various steps and methods to be followed by researchers for writing good research articles that can be published in good and reputed journals. With her vast experience as editor of respected journals, she spoke on different aspects functioning behind the entire process of publication and scholarship and how a young researcher may mark a trace for oneself in this scenario. Her speech touched upon the topics like how to choose a good case for research, how to formulate the 'title' of a research paper, how to write introduction of an article, how to collect, process and analyse data for writing, how to write the conclusion and how to present the bibliography. Besides these, she also spoke on the various types of referencing styles and the priorities of









many reputed journals in terms of research areas and presentation styles. Apart from that, she talked about how different journals prioritise different research areas and how to approach a research area to find good publishers. She stressed the idea of uniqueness on a research topic to get selected to good journals. However, nothing can replace the importance of erudite scholarship in research, and one must cultivate that with absolute hard work.

Both lecture sessions were live-streamed on Facebook and attended by many participants from India and abroad. The recordings of the lectures will be later shared on YouTube for the benefit of researchers all over the globe.

PROBLEMS AND PROSPECTS OF SOCIO-ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND DEMOGRAPHIC ISSUES OF SCHEDULE TRIBES OF NORTH-EAST INDIA

The Dept. of Geography, Bodoland University, successfully convened two days National Webinar on "Problems and Prospects of Socio-Economic Development and Demographic Issues of Scheduled Tribes of North-East India" during 30–31 July, 2021. Prof. U.K. De of Economics Department, NEHU delivered plenary speech on 'Socio-Economic Development issues under Pandemic in India' in the first plenary session and Prof. Laishram Ladusingh, Vice-Chancellor of Bodoland University spoke on 'Stitching demographics epidemiological transitions' in second plenary session. Dr. M Hemanta Meitei of Economics Department, Manipur University, Prof. B. K. Kar of Geography Department, Gauhati University, Prof. Sujit Deka, HoD of Geography Department, BU, and Dr. Manjil Basumatary, Academic Registrar of BU, chaired a technical session each. Researchers from renowned institutes like TISS-Mumbai, TISS-Guwahati, IIPS-Mumbai, ISEC-Bangalore, Nehru Memorial Museum and Library-New Delhi, F.M. University-Odisha, NEHU, Martin Luther Christian University-Shillong, Mizoram University, Assam University, Cotton University, Bodoland University etc. participated with paper in the webinar. Few faculty members, research scholars and master degree students from various departments of Bodoland University also participated in the webinar. Total 25 papers were presented in four technical sessions.

In the beginning of the proceedings, Pralip Kumar Narzary, Convener of the mention that the webinar is organized with the objective of providing a platform to the young researchers to share their research work with peers and experts, and to publish some of these papers in the form of an edited book with the renowned publisher. Further, in the concluding remarks, Narzary shared his experience of working outside the North-East Region and encouraged the young researchers by suggesting to publish their works in scopus indexed journals and look for the standing of the journal in Thomson Reuter ranking, and not to fall prey to the predatory journal which claims to have very high impact factors.


Webinars and Workshops



WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY OBSERVED BY NSS CELL

The world environment day was observed in Bodoland University in three different sessions in a befitting manner. In collaboration with the NSS CELL, Bodoland University, the Department of Geography had begun the first session at 10 am online. The webinar started with a welcome speech by Prof. Sujit Deka, the programme coordinator, in the presence of more than a hundred eighty participants. Prof Laishram Ladusingh, the Honorable Vice-Chancellor of Bodoland University, delivered the opening speech as the inaugurator of the event, followed by a Special talk by Dr Bibhab Kumar Talukdar, scientist G and founder member of AARANYAK. 

An Expert Talk on Potentialities of Multifarious Herbs in BTR : Health and Commercial Perspective :



One Day National Webinar on Financial Awareness Date: 11-06-2021


