As per PG Examination Regulations (Clause No. 11.5) the maximum permissible limit for appearing PG examinations is only for three times. In this regard, some grievances have been received from the PG Students who have crossed maximum limit of three times and could not pass the 2nd and 4th Semester PG Examinations and the matter was discussed in the 8th AC meeting held on 3rd July, 2019. The meeting by its resolution constituted a committee by inducting an external member from outside the University to examine the feasibility of addressing the students' grievances for appearing the examinations. The Committee has finally submitted its report and stuck to the relevant rules of other universities adhering to the Clause No. 11.5 of PG examinations Regulations of Bodoland University. The House may think over the matter or find the proper mechanism.
